This document is appropriate for use with 4-6 grades and teen clubs.

Team members (3-4 members) - involve club officers if working with a teen club.

Description:

• Activity Helper

Organize, lead and maintain a 4-H club for the purpose of helping youth:

- 1. develop positive self-concepts and social skills.
- 2. learn knowledge and skills related to subject matter of their choice.

Specific duties/responsibilities: *

- 1. Plan with club members a club calendar of events which includes monthly meetings, project group meetings and special activities.
- 2. Work with club officers to plan and conduct monthly business meeting.
- 3. Follow through on planned learn-by-doing experiences for the educational program of each meeting.
- 4. Involve parents in performing assigned, meaningful responsibilities with regard to club operations.
- 5. Assist 4-H'ers in identifying interests and setting personal learning goals.
- 6. Involve 4-H'ers in meaningful leadership roles.
- 7. Teach parliamentary procedure.
- 8. Structure opportunities for 4-H'ers to practice speaking before a group.
- 9. Teach subject matter by involving 4-H'ers in learn-by-doing activities.
- 10. Keep updated membership records.

Knowledge and skills needed:

- 1. How to identify specific jobs related to club operations and recruit other adults or teens to do jobs.
- 2. Program planning.
- 3. Project selection and do-share-apply.
- 4. Developmental characteristics of youth ages 9 to 19.
- 5. How to design and/or implement fun learn-by-doing experiences.
- 6. 4-H awards program and opportunities.
- 7. Club record keeping.
- 8. How to advise or help youth leaders grow in leadership skills.

Coordinate with:

- 1. 4-H agent
- 2. Community leaders
- 3. Parents
- 4. 4-H'ers

Tenure: One year, renegotiable each year thereafter.

*If you are working with a teen club, be sure the leadership team includes the teen officers. The adult members of a teen club leadership team need to let the 4-H teens assume many of the duties above while the adult helpers coach the teens and provide overall guidance.

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
