2020 HOSTING PERIOD July 25th(arrival) to August 22nd(departure)

You can host a youth aged 12-18 (most are 12-14) or an adult chaperone.
Youth have a range of English language abilities, so host families should be prepared to communicate imaginatively.

HOST FAMILY REQUIREMENTS

- % You must have a child of the same gender who is within 3 years of the hosted youth (children aged 10+ are eligible to host).
- Families without children of the appropriate age <u>may host an adult</u> <u>chaperone</u> for 2 or 4 week stays.
- Complete an application and <u>successfully pass</u> a background screening and home visit.
- Attend required host family orientations and gatherings.
- No special activities need to be planned since these youth want to experience American culture, make new friends, and improve their English by staying with your family.
- * This is a voluntary program; no stipends will be provided.
- **It is <u>not required</u> to be involved with 4-H to be considered**.
