## **COVID Protocols**

We think it is becoming more possible for county clubs to begin practice, but it will be determined by each county. Our advantage is we are outdoors. Even so, there are methods and protocols we can use to reduce health risks, to be combined with our normal risk management.

Protocols for NC 4-H Shooting Sports events, including practices and tournaments. Participants must be enrolled in 4-H online: youth, volunteer leaders, and coaches.

Volunteer leaders/coaches must have completed a background check through NCSU and completed all volunteer training required by the University.

All participants must complete the covid19 training.

Participants must pre-register for the event.

Each individual must have their temperature checked with a non-contact thermometer, immediately upon arrival. Anyone, who has a temperature above 100 F., should immediately leave the grounds and consult their physician. For a multiple day event, each individual will have their temperature checked at the beginning of each day.

To comply with distancing guidelines, shooters must use every other normal shooting lane to ensure 8+ feet separation.

Facilities for hand and equipment sanitizing must be available at each location.

At any 4-H shooting event/activity, face coverings must be worn at all times until shooters take up their position on the firing line. Participants do not need to wear their mask while shooting but must be wearing their mask as they leave the firing line. The command to remove and replace face coverings should become part of the range commands.
