WHEREAS, the program's more than 260,000 urban, suburban, and rural youth participants, ranging in age from five to eighteen, hail from diverse ethnic and socioeconomic backgrounds and represent a cross-section of our state; and

WHEREAS, 4-H could not have accomplished what it already has without its more than 13,000 adult volunteers, who have generously given their time, talent, energy, and resources to the youth of North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, the State of North Carolina is proud to honor the important work being done by 4-H, and encourages the continuing development of young North Carolinians across our state;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim October 3-9, 2021, as "NATIONAL 4-H WEEK" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
